Adopted at AIMC National Convention on

Peace and Justice: Our Responsibilities Sunday, February 28, 2016

The issue of peace and justice for all has been a prime objective for the All India Milli Council (AIMC) since its inception in 1992. In line with this objective, it has organized a number of programmes, participated by representatives of Muslims, other religious, social, political, legal and human rights organizations and luminaries and passed resolutions therein time and again. This national convention on “**Peace and Justice: Our Responsibilities**” is in consistence to its earlier efforts.

1. In continuation to the resolutions adopted at its Anti-TADA National Convention (August 2, 1994, Ambedkar Auditorium, AP Bhawan, New Delhi), TADA and Rule of Law National Convention (May 1995, Sapru House, New Delhi), POTA and National Security National Convention (November 15, 2001, Rajendra Bhawan, New Delhi), Terrorism and Justice National Convention (April 27, 2008, Khalsa College Auditorium, New Delhi), Protection of Muslim Youth National Convention (March 31, 2012, Mavalankar Hall, New Delhi), Movement for Justice National Convention (April 6, 2013) and also its annual conferences, this national convention of the All India Milli Council, held at Mavalankar Hall, New Delhi on Sunday, February 28, 2016, reiterates its affirmation and determination to endeavour for peace and justice.
2. Expressing concern over the inclusion of some of the draconian measures of the TADA and POTA in the UAPA and its as well as other laws, this national convention urges a status report on the cases registered and persons detained under the TADA, POTA, UAPA and other draconian laws applied in the states .
3. Welcoming the acquittal of a number of accused persons in cases of terror by the courts, this national convention of the AIMC calls for their rehabilitation with respect and honour and initiating cases against those responsible for their harassment.

4. This conference strongly denounces and condemns the ISIS and its activities.
5. Appealing for peace on the JNU campus, this convention demands justice in the Rohith Vemula case and those accused in the JNU incident and judicial enquiry into the anti-national sloganeering by the outsider on the campus.
6. Sensing the feeling of deprivation, fear and insecurity, this convention asks the government to remove the fear in the minority community over clouds of uncertainty in respect of the minority status of well known minority institutions, Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) and Jamia Millia Islamia (JMI).
7. Welcoming President Pranab Mukherjee's call for change in IPC, this convention demands police reforms and also review of all the draconian laws, including AFSPA framed by the colonial power against the people of the country.
8. This convention urges the government to review the provision of sedition law in the letter and spirit of the Constitution.
9. This national convention of the AIMC urges the central government to take special measures to end the existing atmosphere of intolerance, mistrust and disharmony.
10. This convention appeals to the audience present here and all the people of India to take all possible acts and steps for the sake of peace and justice to prevail in the country.
11. In the event of registered cases against persons without evidences, this convention calls for opening of fast-track courts for the speedy trial of the cases.
12. This convention welcomes the concerns of Justice TS Thakur, Chief Justice of India for delay in enforcement of laws and appointment of High Court judges saying "time has come to audit government's performance". The government cannot be sitting over the proposal (on judges appointment) for more than two months while people are "languishing in jails" and "crying for justice"
